

WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT?

Prop 22, which multi-billion dollar gig companies wrote so they could cheat their workers. This loophole allows them to make billions of dollars while ignoring worker protections like minimum wage, worker's comp, and unemployment insurance.

Uber, Lyft, Instacart and DoorDash paid to put Proposition 22 on the ballot. They hired lawyers to write a misleading initiative and paid political operatives millions to collect the voter signatures they needed.

Prop 22 is a carve out in law that allows Uber and app companies to deny their drivers rights and protections like paid sick leave, workers compensation or unemployment benefits.

WHY IS THIS IMPORTANT?

Prop 25 ends money bail, which is wasteful, unfair, and ineffective. The \$2 billion for-profit bail bond industry lets the rich go free, regardless of their crime, while the poor sit in jail awaiting trial. This is discriminatory and unsafe. Prop 25 creates a better system, based on public safety instead of ability to pay.

Innocence should be determined by a system of equal justice under the law - but that's not how the money bail system works. Meanwhile, wealthy individuals charged with serious violent crimes can walk free - no matter how much of a threat they are to public safety.




