FUSD Trustee, Diverse Valley Coalition Call For Safe Water Fund

(Fresno, CA) Genoveva Islas, who represents Fresno Unified District 4, residents who are impacted by unsafe drinking water, advocates and health professionals from across the Valley will rally Friday to support the establishment of a safe, affordable drinking water fund.

More than one million Californians and hundreds of communities are impacted by unsafe drinking water each day. This is a statewide crisis, however low-income communities and communities of color are hit the hardest.

Overall, more than 300 public water systems in California are out of compliance with state standards for harmful contaminants including arsenic and nitrates.

Meanwhile, more than 800 schools in California have lead-contaminated drinking water in excess of 5 parts per billion, according to a report released by CALPIRG. There is no safe level of lead.

To effectively address this crisis, our leaders should ensure that responsible parties pay their fair share and that the fund:

- Provides permanent funding for drinking water in the amount of at least \$150 million annually
- Includes resources for state smalls, domestic wells and school districts
- Addresses all contaminants including lead and secondary contaminants
- Is protected from borrowing by the general fund and protected from dimunition or cancellation
